Welcoming Statement

We welcome all people in the name of God, who first welcomed us. Every person has worth as a unique creation made in the image of God. We recognize, celebrate, and give thanks for the many diverse gifts of God among us. We are an open and affirming congregation, welcoming into the full life and ministry of the church persons of every race, immigration status, culture, age, gender, sexual orientation, ability, and economic status who seek to join us in following Jesus. Even as we recognize that there remain differences of opinion among us, we strive to model a community of faith and spirit that works toward openness and understanding, offering justice, healing, and wholeness of life for all people.

San Antonio Mennonite Church welcomes all people in the name of God, who first welcomed us.

Partnering to establish God's kin-dom on earth, like Jesus, we welcome those who are not welcome in other places – people who are homeless, anyone with addictions, those with deep doubts or hard questions, persons who long for mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual health.

<u>Seeking the peace of the city</u>², we welcome anyone who knows the <u>pain of violence</u>. As a Mennonite congregation, we claim our heritage as a peace church and we welcome persons who are, were, or may become <u>members of the military</u>.

Following Jesus, we claim <u>reconciliation as the center of our work</u>. We seek <u>racial</u> and <u>economic justice</u> within our congregation and the larger community. We also seek nonviolent alternatives to resolving conflict.

Affirming and celebrating all loving and committed relationships, we mourn the history of the institutional church, which has frequently condemned and excluded persons who identify as gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered, and which has condoned such discrimination by its silence. We commit ourselves to the work of ending such oppression and discrimination.

Every person has worth as a unique creation made in the image of God. We recognize, celebrate, and give thanks for the many diverse gifts of God among us. We are an open and affirming congregation, welcoming into the full life and ministry of the church persons of every race, immigration status, culture, age, gender, sexual orientation, ability, and economic status who seek to join us in following Jesus. We believe that through our diversity, all can grow and practice a unity of faith that transcends our differences.

We recognize that there remain differences of opinion among us. We do not seek to erase our differences. We welcome all in our journey together in faith toward greater understanding and mutual respect.
